- Is it easy to love our children more than we love the LORD?
- Do you think the priests of the Old Testament were held to a higher standard than Godly leaders in the New Testament?
- Do you see any connection with Heb 10:26-27; 12:29 to today's study?
- When we com to God, how important is it to come on His terms?

The theme of the book is a "CALL TO HOLINESS" and it is divided into two parts: Chapters 1-16 emphasize that the <u>WAY</u> TO GOD IS BY <u>SACRIFICE</u>, while chapters 17-27 emphasize that OUR <u>WALK</u> WITH GOD IS BY <u>SANCTIFICATION</u>. In chapters 1-7, we have the <u>REQUIREMENTS</u> FOR SACRIFICE, and in chapters 8-10, we have the <u>REGULATIONS</u> FOR THE PRIESTS.

Chapter 10 - THE <u>ACCEPTANCE</u> OF THEIR OFFERINGS

Ex. 19:22; Ex. 30:7-10, 34-38;

❖ 1A. THE <u>REASON</u> WHY THE SONS OF AARON WERE DEVOURED BY THE FIRE OF THE LORD - 1-2

"offered strange fire" - NIV - "unauthorized fire" - cf. Leviticus 16:1 "before the LORD"

- 1B. Only the high priest was to burn incense Exodus 30:7-10 "no strange incense"
- 2B. Only the high priest could take the incense into the Holy of holies on the Day of Atonement Leviticus 16:2
- 3B. The fire in the censer was to be taken from burning coals off of the altar of sacrifice Leviticus 16:12-13; Isa. 6:1-7
- 4B. <u>It is possible</u> that <u>they were drunk</u> as well cf. <u>Leviticus 10:9; 1 Sam. 3:13; 2:29; 2:22</u> A willful disrespect of the things of the LORD.
- ❖ 2A. THE **REBUKE** OF AARON BY MOSES 3
 - 1B. God <u>DEMANDS</u> holiness of those who draw near to Him "<u>I must be regarded as holy</u>" cf. <u>James 4:8</u> <u>Do you think our culture, our church, is losing the need for regarding God as holy?</u>
 - 2B. God <u>DESIRES</u> to be glorified "and before all the people"

 "I must be glorified" NIV/NASB "honored" "So Aaron held his peace" NIV "remained silent" NASB "kept silent"
- ❖ 3A. THE **REMOVAL** OF THEIR DEAD BODIES 4-5
 - 1B. It <u>REVEALS</u> the <u>unique standards</u> under which the high priest was to serve <u>Leviticus</u> <u>21:10-12</u>
 - 2B. It **REMINDS** us of <u>the consequences which our sin and disobedience</u> can bring Cf. <u>Acts 5:1-11</u> <u>deliberate, willful rebellion</u> against the Lord. <u>Sin bears great consequences!!</u>
- ❖ 4A. THE **RESTRICTIONS** PLACED UPON AARON AND HIS TWO SONS BY MOSES 6-7
 - 1B. They could not <u>MOURN</u> the death of Nadab & Abihu 6 Cf. *Leviticus 21:1-6, 10-12; Ez. 24:15-18*

- 2B. They could not <u>MOVE</u> out of the tabernacle when the anointing oil was upon them 7 Cf. *Lev.* 21:12
- ❖ 5A. THE **REMINDER** FROM THE LORD ABOUT THE HOLINESS OF PRIESTS 8-11
 - 1B. The **PROHIBITION** was clear 9
 - "Do not drink wine nor intoxicating (NIV "fermented") drink, you, nor your sons with you, when you go into the tabernacle of meeting, lest you die"
 - 2B. The **PURPOSES** were stated 10-11
 - ✓ 1C. To Emphasize the importance of their leadership responsibilities before the Lord 10 Cf. Proverbs 31:4-5; 1 Timothy 3:3, 8; Titus 1:7
 - ✓ 2C. To Explain accurately the statutes of the Lord 11 "that you may teach"
- ❖ 6A. THE **RESPONSIBILITY** OF THE PRIESTS IN EATING OF THE SACRIFICES 12-15
 - 1B. The <u>PLACE</u> where they were to eat 12 "beside the altar" and v. 13 "in a holy place" and in v. 14 "in a (ceremonially) clean place"
 - 2B. The <u>PORTIONS</u> were <u>reminders of the Lord's provision</u> of their needs Cf. *1 Cor. 9:13-14*
 - 3B. The <u>PRACTICE</u> of <u>the wave offering</u> was to <u>show that they were thankful</u> to the Lord for what He has provided for them 15 "wave offering" cf. Lev. 7:28-34 <u>How thankful</u> <u>are you/we?</u>
- ❖ 7A. THE **REACTION** OF MOSES TO THE FAILURE OF AARON'S SONS TO EAT THE SIN OFFERING IN THE HOLY PLACE 16-18
 - "Moses made careful inquiry" NIV "inquired about" NASB "searched carefully" Cf. Lev. 6:24-30
 - 1B. The <u>ANGER</u> of Moses was based on <u>what appeared to be disobedience</u> on the part of Aaron 16-18
 - 2B. The <u>ATTITUDE</u> of Aaron was rooted in his desire <u>to honor God and please Him</u>, and not be hypocritical in the performance of his duties 19 Cf. *I Samuel 15:22-23; 16:7; Psalm 51.-16-17; Micah 6:6-8*
- ❖ 8A. THE **RESPONSE** OF AARON 19-20
 - 1B. He <u>DEFENDED</u> his sons 19a "Look, this day have they offered their sin offering and their burnt offering before the LORD"
 - 2B. He **<u>DESCRIBED</u>** his problem 19b
 - "and such things have befallen (NIV "happened") me! If I had eaten the sin offering today, would it have been accepted in the sight of the LORD?" (NIV "would the Lord have been pleased") (NASB "would it have been good in the sight of the Lord?")
 - 3B. He **DECLARED** his motive to the satisfaction of Moses 20
 - "So when Moses heard that, he was content" NIV "satisfied" NASB "it seemed good in his sight" Do you desire to fully please the LORD?

Nadab and Abihu's sin was <u>wickedness</u> - They lit strange fire, drew attention to themselves; their judgment clouded with drink. Sin bears great consequences!!

Ithamar and Eleazar sinned as well, but theirs was a sin of weakness and inability.

So, whose are your sins like? The former-consuming fire; the later- grace and forgiveness, the mercy and patience of our Father!

Moses saw something about the heart of Aaron—a broken heart over the sin of his children, desiring to please the LORD! *Psalm 51.-16-17*; Are you broken hearted? Over your unbelieving children, family members?

When we come to God, we must come to Him on His terms! It's not an arrangement that we can make! We are not making the rules! God is the One who saves and He is the One who says how we shall be saved. Jesus Christ says that no man comes to the Father but by Him!!
