Session #21: "SANCTIFY THE PRIESTS" — Leviticus 22:1-33

Note: Reference has been made in the following notes and outline to commentaries on Leviticus by <u>David Hocking</u>, also to comments/notes from Pastor Chuck Smith, J. Vernon McGee and Jon Courson.

Questions:

- Can you do anything about your own holiness?
- Can you do anything about your position in holiness?
- v. 3 Can you cut yourself off from the presence of the LORD? If so, what would cut you off?
- Do you think that verse 25 might mean that monetary gifts should not be taken from unbelievers?
- If only sacrifices without defects are acceptable, how can you and I come to God?

The theme of the book is a "CALL TO HOLINESS" and the book divided into two parts: chapters 1-16 show us that the <u>WAY</u> TO GOD IS BY <u>SACRIFICE</u>, and chapters 17-27 reveal that our <u>WALK WITH</u> GOD IS BY <u>SANCTIFICATION</u> or "holiness."

In chapter 17 we dealt with the issue of the "CLEANSING OF BLOOD";

In chapter 18 we dealt with the "COVERING OF OUR SEXUALITY."

In chapter 19 we examined the "CONDUCT OF GOD'S PEOPLE"

In chapter, 20 we saw the "THE NEED FOR HOLINESS"

In chapter 21, we looked at the "*THE STANDARDS FOR PRIESTS*", including the regular priests as well as the high priest.

The key verses of the book deal with the command to be "holy" mentioned in *Leviticus 11:44-45; 20:7, 26; 21:8* as well as in chapter 19, verse 2 - "*Ye shall be holy; for I the LORD your God am holy.*"

The primary reason for the command to be "holy" <u>is rooted in the character of God Himself</u>. He says, "*for I the LORD your God am holy*." That principle and command for holiness among God's people <u>especially</u> applied to the selection of priests.

We see in this chapter a continuation on the expansion of holiness.

In chapter 21, verse 6, we read, "<u>They shall be holy unto their God, and not profane the name of their God</u>". Verse 8 reads, "<u>He shall be holy unto thee for I the LORD, which sanctify you am holy</u>." Verse 12 adds, "<u>I am the LORD</u>," and verse 15 says, "<u>for I the LORD do sanctify him</u>" which is repeated again in verse 23 – "<u>for I the LORD do sanctify them</u>".

The issue of chapter 22 is the <u>matter of the sanctification of the priests</u>, the <u>practical application of</u> <u>holiness</u> on the part of those whom God has separated for His service and His worship.

v. 2 - "that they do not profane my holy name by what they dedicate to Me: I am the LORD"

v. 9 - "I the LORD do sanctify them"

v. 16 - "for I the LORD do sanctify them"

v. 32 - "I am the LORD who sanctifies you"

The phrase "*I am the LORD*" *is* used <u>seven times</u> in ch. 22. The chapter is divided easily by the phrase, "*And the LORD spoke unto Moses, saying*" - it appears in *vv. 1, 17*, and *26*. The last three verses stress the reason behind these instructions.

◆ 1A. THE PRIEST MUST BE <u>CLEAN WHEN OFFERING</u> THE SACRIFICES - 1-16

> 1B. It involves his **PERSONAL PRACTICES** - 1-9

The words in v. 2, "*that they sanctify themselves from the holy things of the children of Israel*" are translated by the NIV as "*treat with respect*" <u>2 Cor. 7:1</u>

- 1C. The <u>Seriousness</u> of being unclean 3 "that soul shall be cut off from my presence" <u>Ps. 16:11; 51:11</u>
- 2C. The <u>Situations</u> that make him unclean 4-8
 - ✓ 1D. Infectious disease "leper"
 - ✓ 2D. Bodily discharge
 - "a running issue" or "seed (sperm) goes from him"
 - ✓ 3D. Defilement by touching

"touches any thing that is unclean by the dead" NIV - "defiled by a corpse" vv. 5-6 – "touches any creeping thing"✓ 4D. Death of an animal - 8

- "dies of itself" or "torn with beasts"
- 3C. The <u>Sanctification</u> involves obedience to what God has commanded 9
 v. 6 "he wash his flesh with water"
- > 2B. It involves his **FAMILY PARTICIPATION** 10-16
 - 1C. The <u>Restrictions</u> are clear
 "no stranger" or "hired servant" 10 & 13b
 v. 12 no priests daughter" who marries a "stranger"
 - 2C. The **Responsibilities** are obvious
 - \checkmark 1D. As to the "slave" 11
 - ✓ 2D. As to the "daughter" who is widowed or divorced has no child, and returns to her father's house 13
 - 3C. The <u>Recompense</u> for a mistake is required 14 cf. *Lev.* 27:9-15 "*fifth part*"
- ◆ 2A. THE PRIEST MUST BE CAREFUL AS TO WHAT IS OFFERED 17-25
 - 1B. It should be offered without <u>DUTY</u> or obligation 19 "offer of your own free will"
 - 2B. It should be offered without <u>DEFECTS</u> 19-21 "without blemish"
 - ➢ 3B. It should be offered without <u>DISABILITIES</u> 22a
 - ➢ 4B. It should be offered without DISEASE 22b
 - > 5B. It should be offered without **DEFICIENCIES** 23-24
 - ➢ 6B. It should be offered without DEFILEMENT by a stranger's hand 25 cf. <u>Mal. 1:6-14</u>
- ★ 3A. THE PRIEST MUST BE <u>CAUTIOUS ABOUT WHEN TO OFFER</u> A GIVEN SACRIFICE 26-30
 - ▶ 1B. When the animal has been weaned by its mother 27
 - > 2B. When the animal is not killed at the same time as its young 28
 - 3B. When a person does it willingly and eats it the same day 30 How willing are you to give your best to the LORD?
- ♦ 4A. THE PRIEST MUST BE <u>COMMITTED TO OBEYING GOD'S COMMANDS</u> LEV. 22:31-33
 - > 1B. The **MEANING** of this commitment
 - 1C. <u>Rely</u> upon His commands "*keep my commandments*" His Word is true! I rely upon it! <u>Cf. Mt. 22:36-40; Jn. 13:34-35;</u>

<u>14:15;</u>

- 2C. <u>Respond</u> to His commands "*do them*"
- 3C. <u>Refuse to profane His holy name!</u> Do you treat His name lightly? Cf. Ps. 75:1
- > 2B. The **MOTIVES** we should have:
 - ✓ 1C. <u>Recognize Who He is</u> "*I am the LORD*" cf. <u>Mt. 6:9</u>
 - ✓ 2C. <u>Realize what He has done</u>
 "I am the LORD who sanctifies you"
 - ✓ 3C. <u>Remember how He redeemed you and delivered you</u> "that brought you out of the land of Egypt to be your God"
