INTRODUCTION - *Romans 1:1-17* - THE PRINCIPLES OF THE RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD - *Romans 1:18-8:39* - Principle #1 - CONDEMNATION - *1:18-3:20*

1A. **CONDEMNATION** OF THOSE WHO REJECT THE REVELATION OF GOD - ROMANS 1:18-32

1B. Their **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT** of God in creation condemns them - 18-23

Rom 1:18 For the <u>wrath of God is revealed</u> from heaven against <u>all ungodliness and</u> <u>unrighteousness</u> of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,

Rom 1:19 because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them.

The "wrath of God is revealed" - the passage begins with the reasons,

and ends with the **results** or proof of this opening statement.

The Greek word, *orge*, is used 36 times in the NT of which 11 are in Romans.

The term "wrath of God" is found in John 3:36; Eph. 5:6; and Col. 3:6.

Cf. Rom. 1:17 & 3:21 where the "righteousness of God...is revealed"

The "wrath of God" is directed toward "all ungodliness and unrighteousness"

Notice three things: 1C. The **Suppression** of the truth - 18-19 - "who hold (hold down; suppress - in NIV and NAS) the truth in unrighteousness" - cf. II Peter 3:5-7

- 1D. The problem behind the deliberate suppression of the truth "unrighteousness" Jude 16-19
- 2D. The **proof** is rather obvious 19 *Psalm 19:1-6*; *Isaiah 40:26*; *Jeremiah 10:10-13;Acts 14:11-18*; *17:23-30*.

Rom 1:20 For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are <u>clearly seen</u>, being <u>understood</u> by the <u>things that are made</u>, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are <u>without excuse</u>.

- 2C. The **Seriousness** of their rejection 20 "without excuse"
 - 1D. The **power** of God is "clearly seen" "things that are made" Greek: poiema cf. Eph. 2:1; John 1:3; Col. 1:16.
 - 2D. The **presence** of God before the creation is "understood"

He would have to be "eternal." - cf. Col. 1:17 - "before all things"

Rom 1:21 <u>because</u>, although they knew God, <u>they did not glorify Him as God</u>, <u>nor were thankful</u>, but <u>became futile in their thoughts</u>, and <u>their foolish hearts were darkened</u>.
Rom 1:22 <u>Professing to be wise, they became fools</u>,

- 3C. The Steps leading to their rejection 21-23 vv. 19 & 21 begin with dioti "because"
 - 1D. They **refused** to glorify God "they did not glorify Him as God" Cf. Romans 3:23; I Cor. 10:31; Psalm 29:1-2; Rev. 4:11.
 - 2D. They **rebelled** against giving thanks to God "nor were thankful" cf. Luke 17:11-19; Psa. 100: II Tim. 3:1-5 "unthankful"
 - 3D. They **reasoned** in their own minds as to what might have brought the universe into existed "became futile in their thoughts" NASB "speculations" Eph. 4:17-19 Greek: dialogismois used 14 times as a noun, 16 times as a verb.
- 4D. They **regarded** themselves as intellectually capable "*Professing to be wise*" cf. *I Cor. 1:19-21* Rom 1:23 and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man--and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.
 - 5D. They **reduced** the Creator to that which has been created 23 "changed" NIV/NASB "exchanged" cf. Psalm 106:19-22
 - CONCLUSION: (1) Mental and spiritual darkness is the result of leaving God out of your thinking and your behavior! v. 21 "their foolish hearts were darkened"
 - (2) Religious paganism is the result of our failure to worship the God of all creation!
 - v. 22 "they became fools" Isaiah 44:9-20; Jeremiah 2:11-13.
