• 3B. <u>The PROMISE of God</u> -31-34 Five great questions regarding our security

Rom 8:31 <u>What then shall we say to these things?</u> If (and it is true!) God is for us, who can be against us?

"What then shall we say to these things?" - cf. <u>Rom. 3:5; 4:1; 6:1; 7:7; 8:31; 9:14, 30</u> The immediate context of "these things" deals with the facts about our assurance, such as the Person and work of the Holy Spirit, the purpose of God in "**all things**" etc.

✓ 1C. As to <u>His Protection</u> – 31 - QUESTION #1 - "If (since) God be for us, who can be against us?" The PREMISE: "If God be for us" - "if (since)" - and it is true! (ei with indicative) - cf. <u>Psalm 27:1-5</u>; <u>46:1-3</u>, <u>7</u>, <u>11</u>; <u>56:4</u>, 11; <u>62:1-2</u>, <u>5-6</u>; 1 Cor. 16:9; <u>1 John 4:4</u>; 5:18 - cf. Joshua 1:5, 9; 10:42; 1 Sam. 14:6; <u>17:45-47 - God is always for you/us!!!</u>

Rom 8:32 <u>He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how</u> shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?

✓ 2C. As to <u>His Provision</u> – 32 - QUESTION #2 – "How shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?" The PREMISE: "He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all" - "freely give" - Greek: charisetai - cf. Psa. 84:11; <u>Eph. 1:3</u> – "blessed" – There is some implication here that God could have done it another way. But we see the cross was God's way of glorifying His Son! He paid it all- past, present and future!!

Rom 8:33 Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies.

✓ 3C. As to <u>His Pardon</u> – 33 - QUESTION #3 – "Who shall bring a charge of God's elect? - The PREMISE: "It is God who justifies" - Cf. Isa. 54:17; 61:1-3; 64:6-8; Rom. 3:21-28; Titus 3:5; James 3:13-18, 8-12; Rev. 12:9-11 You have been pardoned from everything you have done or ever could do.

Rom 8:34 Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us. (Take that!!)

✓ 4C. As to <u>His Prayer</u> – 34 - QUESTION #4 – "Who is he that condemns?" The PREMISE: "It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, - who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us" - cf. Heb. 7:25; 9:24; 1 John 2:1-2 (advocate) - cf. Psa. 109:30-31; John 3:16-18; 8:3-11 - "the right hand" (closest to the Father, also expresses power and authority- the One who is to judge) - Mark 16:19; Acts 7:56; Col. 3:1; Heb. 1:3; 8:1; 1 Pet. 3:22

• 4B. <u>The POWER of love</u> - 35-39

Rom 8:35 <u>Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?</u> Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword (dying)? Rom 8:36 As it is written: "FOR YOUR SAKE WE ARE KILLED ALL DAY LONG; WE ARE ACCOUNTED AS SHEEP FOR THE SLAUGHTER."

Rom 8:37 *Yet in all these things* we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

Rom 8:38 For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, Rom 8:39 nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

✓ 5C - As to the Power of His love - QUESTION #5 - "Who (or what) shall separate us from the love of Christ?" - The PREMISE: "we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us" - (Gr: hupernikao)

(1) We become <u>stronger (not weaker) through trials</u> - cf. <u>2 Cor. 12:9-10</u>; <u>1 Pet. 5:8-10 We don't</u> just get out of it; We become strengthened!

(2) We <u>have a future reward</u> - <u>2 Cor. 4:17-18</u>. v. 36 - quote from <u>Psa. - 44:20-26</u> speaks of Israel's suffering - being cast off by God and scattered among the nations - *cf. Rom.* 11:1-2 *cf. Heb.* 11:32-12:2 - *cf. John* 6:37-39; 10:28-30
