- 4B. THE PRINCIPLE OF FAITH Romans 10:5-11

Rom 10:5 For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the

<u>law</u>, "THE MAN WHO DOES THOSE THINGS <u>SHALL LIVE BY THEM</u>." 1C. What <u>Moses Writes</u> – 5 - cf. <u>Lev. 18:5</u>; <u>Ezek. 20:11, 13, 21</u>; <u>James 2:10</u> - Greek: graphei -"writes" Whose life is proof of that?

Rom 10:6 But the **righteousness of faith speaks** in this way, **"DO NOT SAY IN YOUR HEART, 'WHO WILL ASCEND INTO HEAVEN**?' " (that

is, to bring Christ <u>(Messiah</u>)down from above)

2C. What <u>righteousness Declares</u> - 6-10 - cf. <u>Deut. 30:11-14</u>
1D. It <u>refuses to accept any act of human effort or performance or personal worth</u> - 6 - "Do not say in your heart..." (<u>No effort on your part whatsoever</u>! This is the point of the whole Law!) This says the opposite of "earning" your salvation!

Rom 10:7 or, "<u>'WHO WILL DESCEND</u> INTO THE <u>ABYSS?</u>'" (that is, to bring Christ <u>(Messiah</u>)up from the dead).

"the abyss" - Greek: abussos - used 9 times -translated "the bottomless pit" - the place of Satan and demons, and where the Antichrist comes from – "the beast" and where Satan will be bound for 1000 years - Rev. 20:1, 3.

Eph. 4:8-10 - speaks of Christ <u>descending into the "lower parts of the earth</u>" - <u>1 Pet. 3:19</u> tells of Christ going to preach (proclaiming <u>the gospel of judgment</u>, which they had rejected, facing for the first time in their lives what they had rejected!) to the "*spirits in prison*" which according to *v. 20* were those who died in the flood of Noah's day.

Rom 10:8 But what does it say? "THE <u>WORD</u> IS NEAR YOU, IN YOUR MOUTH AND IN YOUR HEART" (that is, <u>the word</u> (rhema, gospel, confession) <u>of (the) faith which we preach</u>): -

v. 8 – ''word'' - Greek: rhema "the word of the faith- that are preached!
2D. It reinforces the necessity of personal faith (belief) in the word of God – 8 - cf. 1 Cor. 1:18, 21

The point of this passage is that <u>faith does not cause His incarnation or His resurrection</u>! <u>Faith is resting in the proclamation of what has already occurred</u> – He came into this world and died for our sins, and He arose from the dead and is now ascended to the right hand of the throne of God. <u>Our responsibility is to put our faith in what has already occurred</u>, <u>not in our</u> <u>ability to believe</u>, but <u>in what He alone did for us! Pagan Gentiles are saved by faith alone!</u>

Rom 10:9 that if you <u>confess</u> (opposite of denial) with your mouth the Lord Jesus (Jesus as LORD-the God of the Bible) and <u>believe in your</u> <u>heart that God has raised Him</u> from the dead, you will be saved. <u>Rom 10:10</u> For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

3D. It requires our response to the Word - 9-10

1E. <u>Outward confession (acknowledgement, opposite of denying) before men-including</u> unbelievers - cf. *Matt. 10:32-33; Luke 9:26; 1 John 1:9; 2:22-23*

2E. <u>Inward conviction</u> - The resurrection is true whether we believe it or not, which only goes to prove beyond doubt that salvation is by faith alone - <u>faith that rests solely upon the</u> word of God!

Rom 10:11 For the Scripture says, "<u>WHOEVER BELIEVES ON HIM</u> WILL NOT BE PUT TO SHAME (disappointed)."

3C. <u>What the Scripture Demands</u> – 11 - cf. <u>Mark 8:38</u>; Romans 1:16; <u>5:5; 6:21</u>; <u>9:33; 2 Timothy</u> <u>1:7-8, 12; 1 John 2:28</u>

5B. THE PROMISE OF SALVATION - Romans 10:12-13

Rom 10:12 For <u>there is no distinction</u> between Jew and Greek, for <u>the</u> <u>same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him</u>.

1C. The <u>Relationship of Jew and Gentile</u> - 12a - *"there is no distinction" cf. Gal 3:28* The same way in the Old Testament as in the New!

2C. The <u>Riches that will come</u> from the Lord - 12b - "the <u>same Lord</u> over all is rich to <u>all who call</u> <u>upon Him" cf. Eph. 2:7; Rom. 9:23</u>

Rom 10:13 For "<u>WHOEVER CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD</u> SHALL BE SAVED."

3C. The **Response that is needed** – 13 - "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved"

1D. It is available to anyone – "whoever" - cf. John 3:16; 4:14; Rev. 22:17

2D. It is **accepted when we call** upon the name of the Lord

3D. It is **absolute in its promise** - "shall be saved"

"SHALL BE SAVED"!!!!

(2Sa 22:4) I will call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised; So <u>shall I be saved</u> from my enemies.

(Psa 80:3) Restore us, O God; Cause Your face to shine, And we shall be saved!

(Isa 45:17) But Israel <u>shall be saved</u> by the LORD With an everlasting salvation; You shall not be ashamed or disgraced Forever and ever.

(Jer 17:14) Heal me, O LORD, and I shall be healed; Save me, and I <u>shall be saved</u>, For You are my praise.

(Joe 2:32) And it shall come to pass That whoever calls on the name of the LORD <u>Shall be saved</u>. For in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there shall be deliverance, As the LORD has said, Among the remnant whom the LORD calls.

(Mat 24:13) But he who endures to the end shall be saved.

(Mar 13:13) And you will be hated by all for My name's sake. But he who endures to the end <u>shall be</u> <u>saved.</u>

(Act 2:21) AND IT SHALL COME TO PASS THAT WHOEVER CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD <u>SHALL BE SAVED.</u>'

(Act 15:11) But we believe that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ we <u>shall be saved</u> in the same manner as they."

(Rom 5:9) Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we <u>shall be saved</u> from wrath through Him.

(Rom 5:10) For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we <u>shall be saved</u> by His life.

(Rom 10:13) For "WHOEVER CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD SHALL BE SAVED."
