#### • #3 - THE RESTORATION OF ISRAEL - Romans 11:1-36

1A. THE REMNANT IS PROOF OF THE RESTORATION - 11:1-6
2A. THE REJECTION WAS PROPHESIED -11:7-10;3A. THE RESULT OF THEIR FALL - 11:11-12
4A. THE RESPONSE THEY WILL HAVE - 11:13-16;
5A. THE REACTION THE GENTILES SHOULD HAVE - 11:17-24
6A. THE REVELATION OF A MYSTERY - 11:25-32; 7A. THE REALIZATION OF GOD'S PLAN - 11:33-36

• <u>1A. THE REMNANT IS PROOF OF THE RESTORATION OF ISRAEL - 11:1-6</u>

The great question: "<u>Has God cast away His people</u>?" - it is unthinkable! God forbid! NASB - May it never be! NIV - By no means! Answer: "<u>God has NOT cast away His people which He foreknew</u>" - cf. <u>Rom.</u> <u>8:29-30; 1 Peter 1:2; Jeremiah 31:35-37</u> Does <u>God go back on His Word</u>?

#### 1B. The EXAMPLES - 1-5

Rom 11:1 I say then, <u>has God cast away His people?</u> Certainly not! For I also am an Israelite, of the seed of Abraham, of the tribe of Benjamin. 1C. Paul himself – 1 – Cf. 1 Cor. 15:10 - God's grace chose Paul - 1 Tim. 1:12-17

Rom 11:2 God has not cast away His people whom He foreknew. Or do you not know what the Scripture says of Elijah, how <u>he pleads with</u> God against Israel, saying,

2C. <u>Elijah</u> - 2b-4 - Cf. 1 Kings 19:10, 14-18
1D. <u>His plead</u> (appeal) - 2b - "pleads with God against Israel" - NIV: "appealed" NASB: "pleads with". He believes that God has cast them away for what they have done.
Rom 11:3 "LORD, THEY HAVE <u>KILLED YOUR PROPHETS AND TORN DOWN</u>

## YOUR ALTARS, AND I ALONE AM LEFT, AND THEY SEEK MY LIFE"?

2D. <u>His attitude</u> - 3

1E. He enumerates all that they have done - "they have killed Your prophets, and torn down Your altars"

2E. He emphasizes that he is the only one left - "I alone am left"

3E. He explains that his own life is in danger and then God will have no one to depend on!

#### Rom 11:4 But what does the divine response say to him? "<u>I HAVE RESERVED FOR</u> <u>MYSELF SEVEN THOUSAND MEN WHO HAVE NOT BOWED THE KNEE TO</u> BAAL."

**3D.** <u>God's answer</u> – 4 - "I have reserved to Myself seven thousand men, who have not bowed the knee to the image of Baal". "Baal" - only usage in NT - used 62 times in OT.

# Rom 11:5 Even so then, at this present time there is a remnant according to the election of grace.

3C. <u>Present time</u> – 5 - "a remnant according to the election of grace" - NIV - "chosen by grace" - NASB - "God's gracious choice" - The Greek word for "election" appears 7 times in the NT (Greek: ekloge(spoken out of)) - The word elektos is used 23 times in the NT. - cf. <u>Acts 9:15;</u> <u>Rom. 9:11;</u> 11:5, 7, 28; <u>1 Thess. 1:4;</u> <u>2 Tim. 1:9</u> - "<u>not according to our works, but according to</u> <u>His own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began.</u>"

#### 2B. <u>The EXPLANATION</u> - 6

#### Rom 11:6 And **if by grace, then it is no longer of works; otherwise grace is no** longer grace. But if it is of works, it is no longer grace; otherwise work is no longer work.

The word "grace" appears <u>131 times</u> in NT; the "grace of God" is used <u>24 times</u>. "and if by grace, then is it no longer of works; otherwise grace is no longer grace. But if it is of works, it is no longer grace: otherwise work is no longer work." <u>What logic!</u> What something <u>is "is!</u>" What something <u>is not "is</u> not!" - "Grace" and "works" are mutually exclusive!

Four Ways of Resisting or Rejecting God's standards of grace:

- 1. <u>Rejection of the "once-for-all" sacrifice of Jesus Christ</u> is described as <u>an insult</u> to the "Spirit of grace" <u>Heb. 10:29</u>
- 2. <u>Refusing to repent is described as coming short</u> of the "grace of God" <u>Heb. 12:15-17</u>
- 3. Resisting God's standards of sexual purity is called "turning the grace of our God into lewdness" Jude 4
- 4. Returning to the law in order to be declared righteous is called "setting aside the grace of God" Gal. 2:21 and "fallen from grace" Gal. 5:4

The Wonder of Grace - Consider the following teachings of the Bible about grace:

- 1. Grace came by Jesus Christ John 1:17
- 2. We are saved by grace *Eph. 2:8-9*
- 3. We are justified by grace *Rom. 3:24*
- 4. Our salvation is a gift of God's grace Romans 5:15
- 5. Grace is greater than our sin Rom. 5:20
- 6. All believers are under grace, not law *Rom. 6:14*
- 7. God is the "God of all grace" <u>1 Pet. 5:10</u>
- 8. God's grace is sufficient and capable of sustaining us under trials/infirmities 2 Cor. 12:9-10
- 9. God's grace has appeared to all men *Titus 2:11*
- 10. Grace characterizes God's throne and grace will be given to help us Heb. 4:16
- 11. Grace is needed to serve God Heb. 12:28
- 12. Grace is given to the humble James 4:6; 1 Pet. 5:5
- 13. <u>Spiritual gifts come from</u> the "manifold grace of God" <u>1 Pet. 4:10</u>
- 14. Believers are exhorted to "grow in grace" in <u>2 Pet. 3:18</u>

15. Believers were chosen before the world was created so that we would be - "to the praise of the glory of His grace" - <u>Eph. 1:6</u>

16. The Lord will continue to show us in the ages to come "the exceeding riches of His grace" -

*Eph. 2:7* How thankful are you that you were "chosen by grace"?

Marvelous grace of our loving Lord, Grace that exceeds our sin and our guilt! Yonder on Calvary's mount outpoured, There where the blood of the Lamb was spilled. Refrain: Grace, grace, God's grace, Grace that will **pardon and cleanse within**; Grace, grace, God's grace, Grace **that is greater than all our sin.**
