- What is the reason that verse 6 refers to as to why we should pay taxes?
- Does the Bible teach separation of church and state? God and government?
- Does the Bible teach that those in government are God's ministers?
- Does verse seven teach, by example, that everything I have is "mine"? What does "render" mean?
- Do you practice being in this world but not of this world?
- How or what does the love in verse 9 respect the rights of others?

Several questions will be asked at the beginning of the study.

- **3A. AS TO THE LAW OF GOD 13:1-14** 1B. Our **SUBJECTION** to the law - 13:1-5
 - > 2B. The SUPPORT of the law 13:6-7

Rom 13:6 For because of this (submission) you also pay taxes, for they are God's ministers (liturgy) attending continually to this very thing.

1C. <u>The Reason - "for because of this</u>" - <u>the need to be subject to</u> the governing authorities 2C. The <u>Responsibility we have</u> - "also pay taxes" (<u>Pay your taxes</u>!) - cf. <u>Matthew 22:15-22</u> - the <u>doctrine of the separation of church and state</u> is based on this passage. <u>Jesus never taught</u> that God should be separated from government!

3C. The **Recognition of the duties of governing authorities** - "for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing" - NIV - those "who give their full time to governing" or NASB - "devoting themselves" - "God's ministers" - Greek: leitourgos used 5 times and related words another 10 times - <u>Rom. 15:16</u>. - Paul uses it of his own ministry - refers to Epaphroditus ministry to Paul's needs while he was in prison (<u>Phil. 2:25</u>) - used of angels in <u>Hebrews 1:7</u> and our Lord Jesus as our High Priest in <u>Hebrews 8:2, 6</u>.. It refers to the public ministry of priests, such as <u>Luke 1:23</u> referring to Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist. It is used of our financial support in <u>2 Cor. 9:12.</u>

Rom 13:7 Render (give back) therefore to all their due: <u>taxes</u> to whom taxes are due, <u>customs</u> to whom customs, <u>fear (respect) to whom fear</u>, <u>honor (esteem to the highest</u> <u>degree - thank you)</u> to whom honor.

4C. The <u>Rendering of what is due</u> -7 - Greek word <u>refers to that which is given back</u> - in this case, the things that are owed - <u>1 Peter 2:17; Dt. 17:18-19</u>

- 1D. Taxes tribute
- 2D. Customs (Greek: *telos* completion)
- 3D. Fear "fear to whom fear" (respect)
- 4D. <u>Honor</u> "honor to whom *honor*"

- 5C. The believer's Relationship to the governments of this world (Note the balance here!)
 1D. In terms of citizenship Phil. 3:20-21 John 17:16 "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world" John 18:36 "My kingdom is not of this world..."
 2D. In terms of commitment Acts 4:18-20; 5:27-29, 40-42
 3D. In terms of conduct Matt. 5:13-16; Titus 2:11-14; 1 Peter 2:11-12, 15
 4D. In terms of prayerful concern 1 Timothy 2:1-4
- > 3B. The SATISFACTION of the law 13:8-10 Love one another used 16 times in NT

Rom 13:8 Owe no one anything except to <u>love one another</u>, for he who loves another has fulfilled the law. <u>John 13:31-35!!</u>

1C. Love Realizes its obligation to others – 8 - "Owe no one any thing except to love one another"
This is not a condemnation of borrowing money, but rather an obligation in every walk of life – to love one another! - cf. <u>Matt. 5:42;</u>

Rom 13:9 For the commandments, "YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY," "YOU SHALL NOT MURDER," "YOU SHALL NOT STEAL," "YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS," "YOU SHALL NOT COVET," and if there is any other commandment, are all summed up in this saying, namely, "YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF."

2C. Love Respects the rights of others - 9.

- 1D. The right of marriage "you shall not commit adultery"
- 2D. The right to life "you shall not kill"
- 3D. The right of property "you shall not steal"

4D. The right of truth - "you shall not bear false witness"

5D. The **right of ownership** - "you shall not covet" - desiring what does not belong to you. – closely related to stealing. "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" - cf. Leviticus 19:11-18

Rom 13:10 Love <u>does no harm</u> to a neighbor; therefore <u>love is the fulfillment</u> (satisfaction) of the law.

3C. Love Refuses to do harm to a neighbor or friend – 10 - "love is the fulfillment of the law" - cf. Galatians 5:14; 6:1-2; James 2:8 - cf. Luke 10:25-37 - cf. Matt. 5:43-48; <u>Mark 12:28-34; Eph.</u> 5:15-21
