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		 <u>Ouestions:</u> During what portion of the Tribulation period does the seventh trumpet sound? When does the sounding begin? End? During what trumpet sound is the involvement of the Lord greater than ever before? Can you think of reasons why God would give us a glimpse of His coming kingdom and of heaven itself in vs. 15-19 – today's study? What is the extent of "the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ"? What all is included? How long does the Bible say the Lord will reign? 1000 years? What is the reaction of the 24 elders to the announcement that the kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ? In v. 18, why do you think the nations are angry? According to the Bible (Psalm 2 & Rev. 19:15), whose wrath/anger is greater, the Lord's or the angry nations? In v. 18, will God judge you in relationship to everyone else? To those who witness to thousands in a large Crusade rally, with hundreds coming to the Lord? In vs. 17-19 there appear four reasons for the 24 elders to give thanks to You, O Lord God Almighty? Should not these reasons?
