Acts Chapter 11:1-18

In this chapter we learn of the relationship between believers in Jerusalem (a Jewish church) and the new Gentile disciples. Keep in mind that the Jerusalem church's problem is not prejudice but rather a misunderstanding of the purposes of God. The OT understanding of God's program was that of an earthly kingdom which would bless the Gentiles through the reign of Israel's Messiah. But the nation had rejected Christ and His kingdom; did this mean that the Gentiles could not be saved? Must they first become Jewish proselytes? Peter's experience at Caesarea (Act_10:1-48) and Paul's revelation of "the mystery of the church" (Eph_3:1-21) helped to answer these questions. Both experiences proved that both Jew and Gentile stand condemned before God and can be saved only through faith in Jesus Christ.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU ARE BAPTIZED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT?

INTRODUCTION: The Baptism by the Holy Spirit:

 There is no evidence that the baptism of the Holy Spirit happened before the Day of Pentecost in <i>Acts 2</i>. – There are no verses that say that the baptism occurred in the Old Testament. Problem of <u>John 20:19-23 – cf Acts 1:5 – When? Before or on the</u> Day of Pentecost? 	/
Statements of <u>Matthew 3:11-12; Mark 1:8; Luke 3:16-17; John</u> <u>1:33-34; Acts 1:4-5</u> indicate that it is still future.

<u>"WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU ARE</u> <u>BAPTIZED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT"? -</u> <u>Acts 11:1-18</u>

This is a **subject that is frequently discussed**! There seems to be **much confusion** in the Christian community.

Mat. 3:11 "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. Believers are baptized by Jesus with the Holy Spirit. Unbelievers are baptized by Jesus into the fire of His judgment.

Acts 11:15-17 And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them, as upon us at the beginning. [16] Then I remembered the word of the Lord, how He said, 'John indeed baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' [17] If therefore God gave them the same gift as He gave us when we believed on the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could withstand God?"

Joel 2:28-29 "And it shall come to pass afterward That I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your old men shall dream dreams, Your young men shall see visions. [29] And also on My menservants and on My maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in those days.

Zec. 12:10 "And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced. Yes, they will mourn for Him as one mourns for his only son, and grieve for Him as one grieves for a firstborn.

Luk 24:26 Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?" Luk 24:27 And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself. v. 15-17 - Here we see the **third of four divine events that broke down the Jews only tradition** that was held by Peter. – **Divine action!**

We see here that although Cornelius was a devout, God fearing, upright, sincere and generous man, **he still needed to hear the** gospel! He needed to repent! To believe in Jesus! Only then did God in His grace save him, give him forgiveness of sins, the gift of the Spirit and life and purify his heart by faith. Moreover, only then was he baptized and thus visibly and publicly received into the Christian community.

The **essence of the story** is that from a negative standpoint, **God shows no partiality or favoritism** and makes **no distinction between races**, and **from a positive standpoint**, **He gave and gives the same Spirit to all alike, not irrespective of faith, but irrespective of circumcision**.

Act 2:4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Following Peter's first sermon: - Act 2:23 Him, being delivered by the determined purpose and foreknowledge of God, you have taken by lawless hands, have crucified, and put to death; Act 2:24 whom God raised up, havin loosed the pains of death, because it was not possible that He should be g held by it. Act 2:38 Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Act 2:39 For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call." Act 2:41 Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added *to them*.

Following Peter's second sermon: - Act 3:15 and killed the Prince of life, whom God raised from the dead, of which we are witnesses. Act 3:19 Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, Act 4:4 However, many of those who heard the word believed; and the number of the men came to be about five thousand.

Philip to the Samaritans: - Act 8:12 But when they believed Philip as he preached the things concerning the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, both men and women were baptized. Peter and John to them...Act 8:15 who, when they had come down, prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit. Act 8:16 For as yet He had fallen upon none of them. They had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Act 8:17 Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

The Eunuch's Conversion in Gaza: - Act 8:35 Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him. Act 8:36 Now as they went down the road, they came to some water. And the eunuch said, "See, *here is* water. What hinders me from being baptized?" Act 8:37 Then Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he answered and said, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." Act 8:38 So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him.

Saul's Conversion: - Act 9:17 And Ananias went his way and entered the house; and laying his hands on him he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you came, has sent me that you may receive your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

<u>Cornelius/Gentiles Conversion:</u> - Act 10:44 While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who heard the word. Act 10:46 For they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God. Then Peter answered, Act 10:47 "Can anyone forbid water, that these should not be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we *have?*" Act 10:48 And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord. Then they asked him to stay a few days.
