DT. 9:25-29 -- THE GRACE OF GOD! NOT OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS, BUT HIS MERCY!

Deu 9:25 ''Thus I prostrated myself before the LORD; forty days and forty nights I kept prostrating myself, because the LORD had said He would destroy you.

Deu 9:26 Therefore I prayed to the LORD, and said: 'O Lord GOD, do not destroy Your people and Your inheritance whom You have redeemed through Your greatness, whom You have brought out of Egypt with a mighty hand.

Deu 9:27 Remember Your servants, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; do not look on the stubbornness of this people, or on their wickedness or their sin,

Deu 9:28 lest the land from which You brought us should say, "Because the LORD was not able to bring them to the land which He promised them, and because He hated them, He has brought them out to kill them in the wilderness."

Deu 9:29 Yet they are Your people and Your inheritance, whom You brought out by Your mighty power and by Your outstretched arm.'

<u>The Biblical Setting: -</u> In chapter 9, God is reminding Israel of **His great and mighty promise to them to enable them** to go into the land of giants and conquer them.

- He tells them! Not because of your righteousness "Deu 9:4-6" "Do not think in your heart, after the LORD your God has cast them out before you, saying, 'Because of my righteousness the LORD has brought me in to possess this land'; but it is because of the wickedness of these nations that the LORD is driving them out from before you. [5] It is not because of your righteousness or the uprightness of your heart that you go in to possess their land, but because of the wickedness of these nations that the LORD your God drives them out from before you, and that He may fulfill the word which the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. [6] Therefore understand that the LORD your God is not giving you this good land to possess because of your righteousness, for you are a stiff-necked people.
- He reminds them of their rebelliousness and provocations! At Horeb –vs. 9-21; At Taberah
 (burning) and Massah (tempted) and Kibroth Hattaavah (graves of craving) and Kadesh Barnea
 (rebellion) vs. 23-24

Now Moses prays: (Note focus: You, Yours – 12x; I, me – 1) "Deu 9:26 Therefore I prayed to the LORD, and said: 'O Lord GOD, do not destroy Your people and Your inheritance whom You have redeemed through Your greatness, whom You have brought out of Egypt with a mighty hand.

• Because of God's past faithfulness to us!

Deu 9:27 Remember Your servants, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; do not look on the stubbornness of this people, or on their wickedness or their sin,

Because of His past faithfulness to our forefathers!

Deu 9:28 lest the land from which You brought us **should say**, "Because **the LORD was not able** to bring them to the land which He promised them, and because **He hated them**, He has brought them out to kill them in the wilderness."

Because of His own glory and reputation among the nations!

Deu 9:29 Yet they are Your people and Your inheritance, whom You brought out by Your mighty power and by Your outstretched arm.'

• Because we are His people!

SUMMARY:

- Whatever favor God should show them, in subduing their enemies and putting them in possession of the land of Canaan, it was not for their righteousness.
- It is good for us often to remember against ourselves, with sorrow and shame, our former sins, and to review the records conscience keeps of them,
- That we may see how much we are indebted to free grace!
- That we may humbly own that we never merited at God's hand <u>anything but wrath and the</u> curse.
- Presently, The Holy One
 - 1. Pleads for us before the mercy-seat,
 - 2. Who not only fasted, but died upon the cross for our sins;
 - 3. Through Whom we may approach,
 - 4. Though self-condemned sinners, we beseech for undeserved mercy
 - 5. We beseech for eternal life, as the gift of God in Him.
- May we indeed, <u>refer all the victory</u>, all the glory, and all the praise, to <u>Him who alone brings</u> salvation!!
