<u>Act 22:10</u> So I said, 'What shall I do, Lord?' And the Lord said to me, 'Arise and go into Damascus, and there you will be told all things which are appointed for you to do.'

Context/Biblical Background – Paul is back in Jerusalem – Acts. 21:17 and following, He had come back from his missionary journey bringing an offering from the Gentile churches to the Jewish church in Jerusalem. He is trying to break down these barriers between the Gentile and Jewish believers by bringing the offering. He also desired to be there for the Feast of Pentecost. Those feast times were great times in Jerusalem. Hundreds of thousands of people would gather. Great holidays. Great times of celebration. Great times of worshipping God. Paul wanted to be there. Now those were the two ostensible reasons. There probably was a third reason that Paul wanted to be there and that is to share the gospel with the Jews. Paul always desired to bring the gospel message to the Jews. He felt that he understood them sufficiently so that he could convince them that Jesus was the Messiah. So here in Acts Chapter 21, he returns. When he was in the temple with four men who had gone through a purification ritual, Jews from Asia gathered making false charges against Paul. A mob gathered. They seized Paul and were seeking to kill him. Guards from the Roman garrison at the temple rescued him. He asked that he be allowed to address the mob. Beginning in verse 1 of Chapter 22, we have that account. It is in that account that Paul brings up his Damascus Road conversion. In that testimony he recited the events of his being apprehended by the Lord and his response. Act 22:7-9 And I fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to me, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?' [8] So I answered, 'Who are You, Lord?' And He said to me, 'I am Jesus of Nazareth, whom you are persecuting.' [9] "And those who were with me indeed saw the light and were afraid, but they did not hear the voice of Him who spoke to me.

Saul's (Paul's) conversion is one of the most significant events in the Bible. Today, we want to look at Paul's second question.

The Lord Meets Paul on the Damascus Road - Saul's Second Question:

<u>Act 22:10</u> So I said, <u>'What shall I do, Lord?'</u> And the Lord said to me, 'Arise and go into Damascus, and there you will be told all things which are appointed for you to do.'

- <u>v. 10</u> What shall I do, Lord? Few venture to really ask God such a question, but when we ask it, we must ask it with submission and determined obedience.
- Saul's question was *personal*. He asked the question with an "I": "*What shall I do, Lord?*" We often are quite interested in what God wants others to do. But the surrendered heart asks, "<u>What shall I do, Lord?</u>"
- In Acts chapter 10 as we read of Peter being called to go to the Gentiles with the gospel, the house of Cornelius in Caesarea, as the Lord is preparing Peter, breaking down some of the prejudice that the Jew had against the Gentile. As the Lord had let down the sheet from heaven in the vision that Peter had, and the command of the Lord was, "Rise, Peter, kill and eat." He said not so, Lord. That is an inconsistent statement. You can't really say, not so, Lord, can you? You can say not so, friend. Not so, to your spouse. But you can't say, not so, Lord. Paul has the correct response. What shall I do, Lord? If you call Jesus, Lord, that is correct. It isn't denying or refusing to do, but Lord, what shall I do?
- So I said, 'What shall I do, Lord?' An important evidence of being converted. Rom 10:9-10 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be

saved. [10] For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. Paul is surrendering himself to the Lordship of Jesus. What shall I do, Lord?

- Paul assures them that when he was so startled on the Damascus Road, he referred himself entirely to a divine guidance. His immediate response was not, "Well, I will be a Christian," but, "What shall I do, Lord? Let the same voice from heaven that has stopped me in the wrong way guide me into the right way, <u>Act_22:10</u>.
- Lord, tell me what I shall do, and I will do it." And immediately he had directions to go to Damascus, and there he should hear further from the Lord, who now spoke to him.
- Another Biblical example of an initial response is in *1Sa 3:10* Now the LORD came and stood and called as at other times, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel answered, "*Speak, for Your servant hears.*"
- What an example this is for each of us! How we need, not only initially, but continually, be seeking our Lord for His providential guidance in asking, "*What shall I do, Lord*?"
- Should that not be our question at the beginning of every day, as well as continuing through each day as we are led by the Spirit in our hourly and daily walk.

SUMMARY:

- ***** <u>What a wonderful conversion?</u> One of the best conversion accounts in the Bible!
- Notice the two great questions Who are You, Lord? What shall I do, Lord?
- Consider well, your answers to both questions. May each of us focus on, "What shall I do, Lord?" Today and all the tomorrows! (ISa 12:23) Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that <u>I should sin against the LORD in ceasing to pray for</u> you; but I will teach you the good and the right way.
- ITh 4:3-6 For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you should abstain from sexual immorality; [4] that each of you should know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor, [5] not in passion of lust, like the Gentiles who do not know God; [6] that no one should take advantage of and defraud his brother in this matter, because the Lord is the avenger of all such, as we also forewarned you and testified.
- 11h 5:16-18 Rejoice always, [17] pray without ceasing, [18] in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
- IPe 2:15 For this is the will of God, that by doing good you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men—
